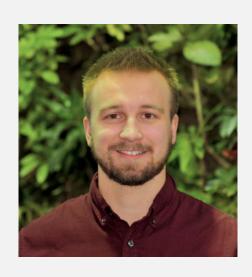

THE PROBLEM

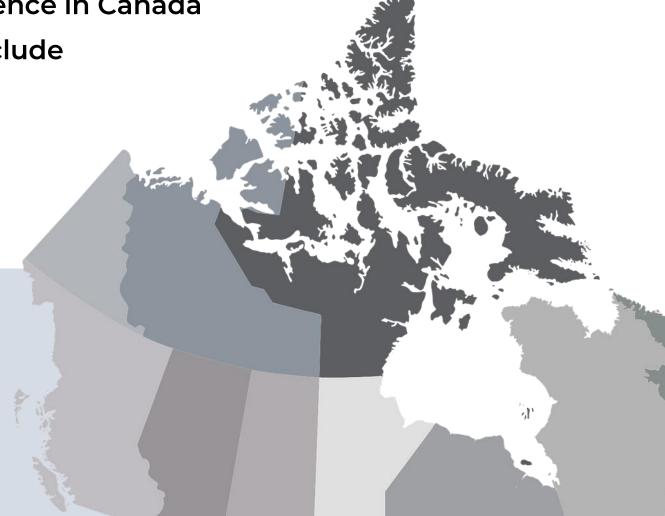
Homelessness is increasing in prevalence in Canada

Factors influencing homelessness include

Poor physical or mental health

- o Domestic abuse
- Employment conditions
- A lack of affordable housing

As a result, unsanctioned tent cities are on the rise across the nation.

- ✓ Adequate shelter
- ✓ Semi-permanent structures
- ✓ Temporary use of land that is planned for development

KEY FINDINGS

Homelessness in Canada and Waterloo Region

- The drivers of homelessness are complex; addiction and mental health challenges are increasingly common factors
- For every \$10 invested towards housing chronically homeless individuals results in a savings of approximately \$21
- Policy, programs and initiatives relating to homelessness have been implemented locally and across Canada











HOMELESSNESS IN WATERLOO REGION

- Homelessness is on the rise in Waterloo
- In 2018, it was estimated that on any given night, there were:
 - 175 chronically homeless individuals
 - 175 episodically homeless individuals
 - 40 unsheltered individuals
- Gentrification and housing affordability are major factors for homelessness in KW

Municipal initiatives have used the "Housing First" approach.

- Designated Employment and Heavy Industrial
- Municipal Comprehensive Review is required to permit residential

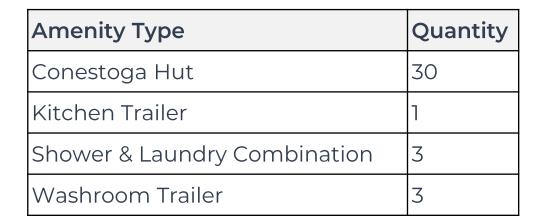
The lot is deemed unfit and unsafe for a Better Tent City

- Setbacks, density, and other standards do not meet Zoning By-law 2019-051 requirements

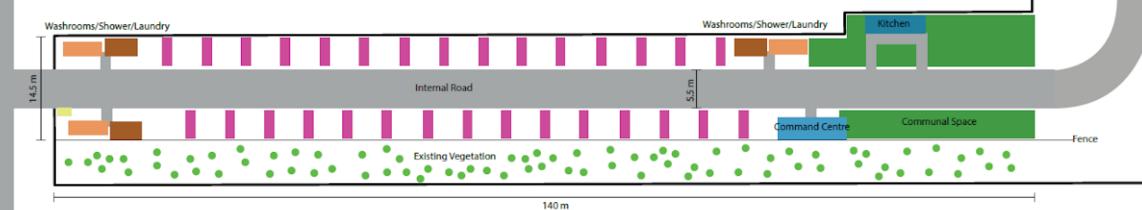
A planning intervention is required; project is feasible

41 Ardelt Place SITE PLAN

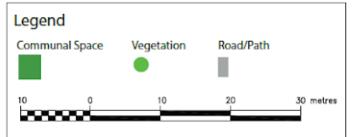

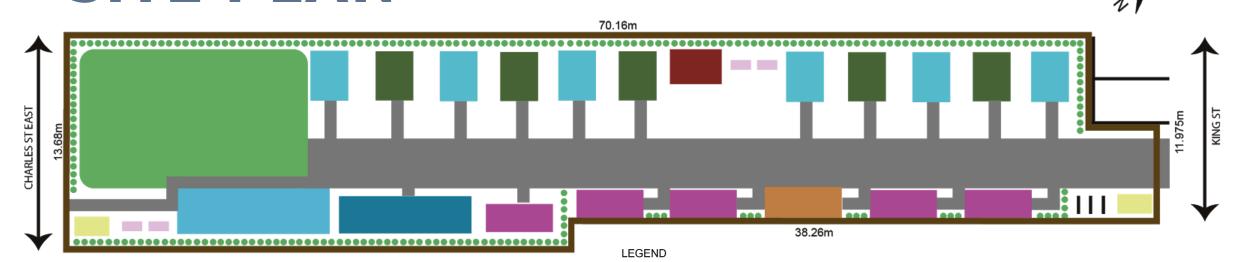




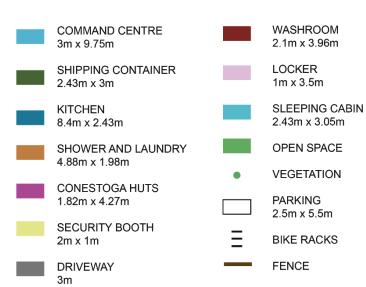


1001 King Street East SITE PLAN

- ✓ Community configuration

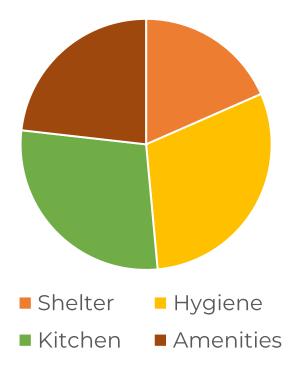




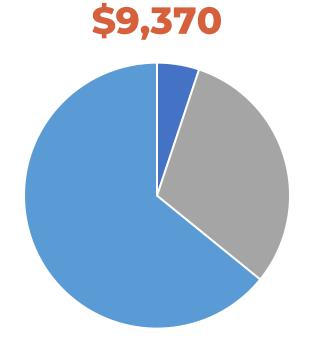
