Acording to statistic Canada, the racialized recent immigrants have higher unemployment rates (13 per cent), compared to racialized Canadian born (5 percent) and non-racialized Canadian born residents (3 percent). Racialized female recent immigrants have higher rates of unemployment rates (15 percent), compared to racialized male recent immigrants (11 per cent).

The deadly links between violent extremism and extreme poverty could be broken through the creation of jobs, and a reduction in inequalities and by building bottom up just and inclusive societies. This includes creation of structured and non-structured rotutine dialuges between policymakers, practishaners, community leaders and academic institutions. The central purpose of these dialogues is to mobilize communities, to find a common ground to work together and enhance their wellbieng.

An increasing amount of evidence confirms that the achievement of gender equality and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) will not be possible without women's economic empowerment. Therefore, PFAC plans to introduce peace and social inovation entrepreneurship programs (PSIE). When the project is put to action, it will enhance family wellbeing and contribute to environmental sustainability. It will also contribute to reducing the impact of institutional, cultural and structural racism and discrimination against women, children, youth and minority communities. This includes contributing to enhancing community inclusion and collaborating to promote positive peace and unity.

Hence PFAC will mobilize and sensitize communities including their cultural and religious leaders, community professionals, governmental and governmental organizations, to develop a sense of urgency to mitigate vulnerabile youth from falling prey to extreme poverty, crime and violent extremism and radicalization.
